What do you need?

- ⇒ rucksack, small sleeping-bag, roll-mat, hiking sticks (optional);
- ⇒ comfortable trekking boots (please bring shoes you hiked before with)
- ⇒ underwear, socks, raincoat, pullover
- ⇒ water bottle
- ⇒ medicines which you take regularly
- ⇒ your ID or passport
- ⇒ pocket money (Polish Zloty and Euro)
- ⇒ good ideas and open mind

Remember: the weight of your rucksack can not be higher than 10% of your body weight!

You should be able to:

- * hike in different weather conditions about 20 kilometers a day
- * sleep in different conditions (youth hostels, parishes)
- * speak English
- * accept unexpected changes :)



Peace hike is addressed to **12 young people** (Kolping members) between 18 and 30 years, mostly from EU countries. Maximum two participants from one country will be involved in this project.

Accommodation and board costs will be covered by financing sources of Programme "Youth in Action".

Travel costs will be reimbursed up to 50% (using the cheapest means of transport);

Participation fee: 30 euro for Central and Eastern Europe, 60 euro for Western Europe
